***PITTSBURGH REGIONAL SCIENCE & ENGINEERING FAIR  
AWARDS CEREMONY***

**WHEN:** Saturday, March 31, 2012

9:30 am to noon

**WHERE:** Heinz Field, enter through Press Gate

**WHO:** All 1,100 entrants—students in grades 6-12—have been invited, along with their parents and teachers

**WHY:** Carnegie Science Center honors winners in numerous categories of awards in the 73<sup>rd</sup> annual Pittsburgh Regional Science & Engineering Fair (PRSEF). More than \$1 million in cash and scholarships will be awarded. Some Senior Division students will be chosen to represent the region at the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF), to be held this year in Pittsburgh May 13-18. Pittsburgh was chosen as the site for the fair this year, and in 2015 and 2018, largely on the strength of PRSEF's history and reputation.

Following the ceremony, students who have won first-place category awards will display their projects in Carnegie Science Center's Atrium, located on the first floor of the main building. The projects will remain on display until Sunday, April 8.
